Topic: 3 Complaints to the Attorney General

Mitch informs everyone that CWA will have to have representation to submit these to the AG. We are not qualified to do that ourselves, we need to make a decision to get that done. These things take years to get anything back on. Whenever someone sends something to the EPA or AG we have to have outside representation.

Veronica: There have been 3 complaints filed against Compton Water. Which will be uploaded onto the website. One by Mr. Cline, one by Sharon Woods and one by Ms. Youngblood. And they are basically all questioning CWA business practices. Everybody is free to ask, it is your right. However CWA cannot answer for ourselves, legal council has to be hired to answer every one of these. In times past there are 2 others pending out there, from 18-24 months, and they haven't been answered yet, but we had to get legal council to write our position to the AG. So what the motion is before the Board is to spend the money, somewhere between \$300-500 a piece to answer these, if we are found to be something that we need to do it could actually go to trial. So if it goes that far we need legal council at that point also. One of the things we have to do is make a motion to spend the money.

Danny Woods: Who is the Attorney General for?

Veronica: The public.

Danny Woods: What is the system here?

Veronica: The public.

Danny Woods: Why do we have to spend anything proving anything to the AG? AG only thing they are going to do is investigate is if there is a problem if there ain't there ain't. You don't have to hire a lawyer to fight a Prosecuting Attorney. The AG is for everybody. Veronica: You have to respond with the Board's position, with documents and backup what the decisions are that you have made from a public standpoint.

Danny Woods: One other question, I served on this Board 22 years, every year we had an audit, that was mandated by the state. Since the water system is paid for you may not need an audit, but do you have an audit every year?

Veronica: In just a minute we will answer a lot of these questions but yes we have an audit every year. We are fixing to do a FAQ, and go through these.

Roger Jones made a motion that CWA set aside the funds to hire an attorney to respond to the AG complaints.

Veronica Clark seconded this motion.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- 1. Why doesn't Compton Water have audits done? ANSWER: It does have annual audits done by an independent auditor, which is a private firm who is trained in the Arkansas requirements of audits for rural utility systems. You can find results on our website at www.comptonwater.com for the prior 5 years.
- 2. How much does our Bookkeeper make? ANSWER: the recent rate increase and budget have the pay for the Bookkeeper at \$1,800.00 per month. Broken down: at 30 hours per week that is \$15.00 per hour. This doesn't include insurance or taxes withheld from the check.
- 3. How much does our Water Operator make: ANSWER: In the recent rate increase and budget there is \$40,000.00 salary for the Licensed Water Operator and the Trainee for Water Operator. This is a job share situation; the Licensed Water Operator portion is \$2,000.00 per month and the Trainee is \$15.00 per hour for 20 hours per week. As the Trainee becomes licensed over the next 12 months, and all is going well with job performance, then the pay will be considered to increase at that time. This averages approx. \$16.00 per hour on a 50-hour week; it doesn't include income tax withholding, insurance nor retirement. Part of this job description includes being on call 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Industry standard in other systems offers retirement, and insurance for Licensed Water Operators; this is cost prohibitive for Compton Water.
- 4. How much does our Meter Reader make: ANSWER: \$450.00 per month, taking approx. 24 man hours to complete the readings, that is \$18.75 per hour.
- 5. Why doesn't Compton Water have an office location? ANSWER: We were planning an office approx. 3 years ago; at the time many legal fees hit us and the money spent on legal fees took from the budget of a building. Because of the continued legal bills, Attorney General complaints, etc., we have had no funds to put towards a building and it is not built into the budget.
- 6. Why does Compton Water need another vehicle? ANSWER: The two very old trucks we have are running out of time, and value; the maintenance on both of them is very high. The number of miles traveled on this system is very high and over roads that aren't well maintained so a truck was approved with a monthly payment of \$500.00.
- 7. Why did my water bill increase so much? ANSWER: The average water bill, if increased slowly over the past few years, would be almost what it is today. The costs to maintain the system have not gone down, the maintenance on the system has increased, old water lines, water tanks that need to be repainted, valves that need replacement, parts and labor has increased, the list is endless.
- 8. Will my water bill ever go down? ANSWER: That is doubtful, but there will be an annual Rate Survey done on our system, if that is ever possible, that will be revealed at that time.

9. I thought all of our loans were paid off: ANSWER: Not so, the enormous late fees, and other charges as well as a very large amount due to South West Boone Harrison was reduced, that was approx. \$297,000.00. The loans that remain are as follows:
